Code Of Practice



- 1. Members must conduct their businesses in properly licensed premises.
- Members holding appropriate licenses are to comply with all UK legal requirements and operate procedures in accordance with the Duty of Care (DOC) Regulations.
- 3. All recovered materials to be supplied in accordance with the accepted industry standards or grade specifications as agreed between buyer and seller.
- Local variations in material quality may be specified by arrangement between buyer and seller.
- 5. Members to have proper Health and Safety Procedures in place and offer appropriate training programmes in their applications.
- 6. All members to recognise the need for quality inspection of material.
- 7. Members of the Association to be properly registered legal entities in the UK or the EU, financially sound, credit-worthy and registered for VAT.
- 8. Members in the supply chain to carry the appropriate insurances to protect their business's and third party interests.
- Members should be willing to be subject to a third party audit of any relevant QA procedures.
- 10. All members of the Association must be committed to supply statistical information on a confidential basis to the Association for collation of National Statistics to aid monitoring against Government targets/regulations
- 11. Members to conduct their business in such a manner as not to bring the industry into disrepute.
